Purposes, Legal Basis and Legitimate Interests for the Data Processing: The Data Processing is conducted in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f UK GDPR, with the following purposes and interests: Exercising our property rights, preventing unauthorised access to the premises (site security), protecting against vandalism, ensuring the functionality of technical systems, and preventing and investigating criminal offences (particularly theft and fraud).
Retention Period or Criteria for determining the Retention Period: Where recordings are made, they are retained for a maximum of 336 hours and are not stored beyond this period.
Data Recipients or Categories of Data Recipients (if a data transfer takes place): A transfer of video recordings to third parties (e.g. police or detective) only takes place when necessary for the investigation of a criminal offense.

Information Regarding the Rights of Data Subjects

The data subject has the right to receive information regarding the processing of personal data by the Controller; if personal data are being processed, the data subject shall have the right to obtain access to the personal data and to the information listed in detail in Art. 15 UK GDPR.

The data subject has the right to have inaccurate personal data concerning him or her rectified by the controller without undue delay, and where applicable, to have incomplete personal data completed (Art. 16 UK GDPR).

The data subject has the right to obtain from the controller the erasure of personal data concerning him or her, if one of the reasons listed in Art. 17 UK GDPR applies, for example when the data are no longer required for the purposes for which they were collected.

The data subject has the right to obtain from the controller restriction of processing if one of the reasons listed in Art. 18 UK GDPR applies, for example when the data subject has objected to the processing, for the duration required for review by the controller.

The data subject shall have the right to object, on grounds relating to his or her particular situation, at any time to processing of personal data concerning him or her. The Controller shall no longer process the personal data unless the Controller demonstrates compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject or for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims (Art. 21 UK GDPR).

Every data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a Supervisory Authority, if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data relating to him or her infringes the GDPR (Art. 77 UK GDPR). The data subject can make this complaint in the Member State of his or her habitual residence, place of work or place of the alleged infringement. In the UK the responsible Supervisory Authority is:
